

Pacific Crossing Appoints New CEO

New Year Ushers in Growing Opportunities for World's Only Independent, Trans-Pacific Sub-Sea Network Provider

DALLAS, Jan. 7, 2008--Pacific Crossing Limited, the major independent provider of undersea capacity between the United States and Japan, is pleased to announce the appointment of Mark Simpson as its new chief executive officer effective January 9, 2008.

Simpson was recently chief operating officer of Asia Netcom, a position he had held since September 2006. With a major upgrade underway for delivery this quarter and a strong and growing reputation as the established premium provider on this route, I am joining PCL at an exciting time as we capitalize on the fast growing demand for trans-pacific bandwidth, build our management team and continue to invest in our core infrastructure."

Rod Boss, who served as CEO for the past year, has been named president and will be responsible for maximizing existing opportunities and assisting strategic direction.

Annunziata said, "The board would like to thank Rod for his leadership over the past year, and we look forward to his further contributions in his new role."
